International studies show that socioeconomic factors such as education, income but also the geographic center of life of families and women in particular had an important influence on the management of the pandemic. Despite all negative side effects of the Corona pandemic there were nevertheless also innovative impulses especially in the field of social work particularly work with families. The special feature of the volume is its global perspective. Authors from different countries describe changes and developments on these topics and make clear what profound effects the pandemic had on families, social inequality structures and gender specific situations. The anthology does not comprehensively reflect international perspectives. Rather it leaves it up to readers to compare the developments in the respective countries with their own country of origin from a comparative cultural perspective. In this way ideas for future overarching research projects may be stimulated.
