He showed normal awareness of his presenting symptoms. No suicidal ideation present. Compliance with medication is good. Will continue with current treatment plan and weekly sessions.

Treatment plan will continue, but will reduce therapy sessions to once every fortnight. John will continue focusing on strengthening his relationships with friends, family members, and colleagues.
