Learning Strategies: Because both sides are equal, learning strategies that work for the right and left would be beneficial to those who do not have a dominant side, like myself.

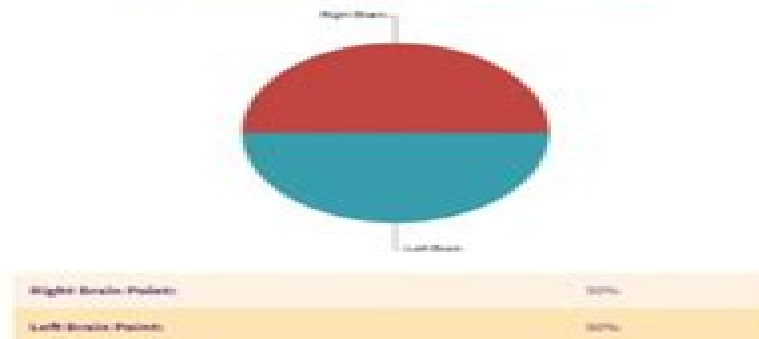
Right Brain:
