MATERIALS:

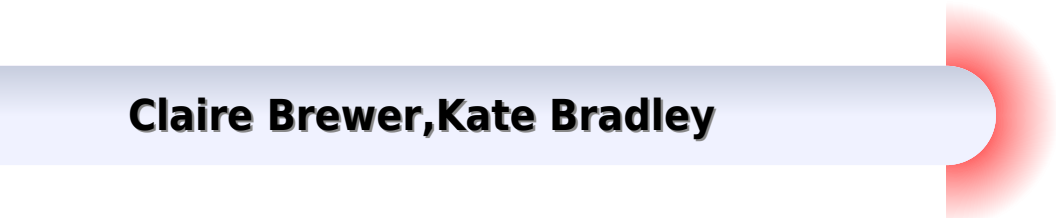
- Red, yellow and blue papers,
