Stochastic global optimization is a very important subject that has applications in virtually all areas of science and technology. Here we present some techniques for solving several problems by means of Fuzzy Adaptive Simulated Annealing (Fuzzy ASA), a fuzzy controlled version of ASA, and by ASA itself. Advanced Mathematical Thinking has played a central role in the development of human civilization for over two millennia. Yet in all that time, the serious study of the nature of advanced mathematical thinking—what it is, how it functions in the minds of expert mathematicians, how it can be encouraged and improved in the developing minds of students—has been limited to the reflections of a few significant individuals scattered throughout the history of mathematics. In the twentieth century, the theory of mathematical education during the compulsory years of schooling to age 16 has developed its own body of empirical research, theory, and practice. But the extensions of such theories to more advanced levels have only occurred in the last few years. In 1976, The International Group for the Psychology of Mathematics, known as PME, was formed and has met annually at different venues round the world to share research ideas.
