Psychotropic Dosing and Monitoring Guidelines

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ABSTRACT

In the past year, there has been a slow but steady trickle of new psychotropic agents into the United States market. In general, there are more novel formulations of older agents than there are novel agents. For example, a transdermal form of selegiline has become available that circumvents some of the problems with traditional monoamine oxidase inhibitors. There are new formulations of zolpidem and carbamazepine that may offer more practical routes of administration for some patients. In addition, there are new hypnotics including eszopicione and ramelteon. In this educational review, the application, dosing, and monitoring of these newer medications is reviewed along with all previously introduced medications.

INTRODUCTION

The pace at which new psychotropic medications are approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration and made available to clinicians remains slow but steady. In the past few years, the FDA has been criticized for not being as thorough as they could be in the review of new drug applications. As a result, it seems unlikely that there will be a barrage of novel agents approved for the treatment of mental disorders anytime in the near future. That being said, a number of new formulations and new indications of existing psychotropics

FOCUS POINTS

- The first monoamine oxidase inhibitor (MAOI) available in patch form, transdermal selegiline, was released in the United States in 2006. The medication may be of benefit to those unable to tolerate traditional MAOIs and circumvents the need for dietary restrictions at the lowest dose of 6 mg/24 hours.
- New hypnotics have become available, including the first hypnotic approved for chronic use (eszopicione) and the first.
 Food and Drug Administration approved melatonin agonist (ramelteon) for decreasing sleep latency.
- The black box warning on atypical antipsychotics has been extended to include a general warning of increased mortality beyond the increased risk of cardiovascular accident in elderly patients treated for dementia-related psychosis.

became available in 2005 and a few new medications have also been approved. We expect this trend will continue in 2006.

No new antidepressant has been approved since duloscetine (Cymbalta, Eli Lilly) was released in 2003. However, after a prolonged review, selegiline transdermal (EMSAM, Somenset/Bristol-Myers Squibb) was FDA approved for the treatment of major depressive disorder in early 2006. Selegiline transdermal is a selective inhibitor of monoamine oxidase-B (MAO-B) that when given transdermally appears to also inhibit cortical MAO-A. Several published studies and more recently completed trials indicate that selegiline transdermal is an effective antidepressant?
