 - o Building blocks for proteins
 - Formed mostly of carbon, hydrogen, oxygen & nitrogen
 - Branching carbon backbone, acid (carboxyl) group & amino group
 - 3 branched-chain amino acids- leucine, isoleucine & valine each with a branching carbon backbone
 - Protein
 - 28 different amino acids make up all proteins via peptide bonds (4 kcal per gram)
