

Main Heading or Title

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Easily readable font sizes are 11 and 12 pts for most people. Keep your font sizes for text boxes consistent and in the same style to preserve uniformity.

Full justify your columns for cleaner edges that give your newspaper that added spice.

Color pages can be print out in black and white. Think grayscale. Although you use a color template, it doesn't mean you can't print it out in black and white.

Black and white template can be converted to color. Most Cloud elements on the template can be re-colored—except images.

There will be times when you want a caption for your picture. Just add a text box, write in your

caption and place it near your picture. See above for example.

Sometimes bold text may look crunched when zooming out to see more of your page. This is normal. don't worry. The spaces are still there. 300% zoom is the true 300 DPI of your newspaper.



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If your story doesn't quite fit, just indicate at the end of the column where the story will continue.

When it comes to placement or design, place your stories first. Build your newspaper around the stories, resizing the pictures so that your text ends where you want it to.

Again, design around your text or the stories. You can enter the text directly into the text boxes here or write it in a word processor and copy the text to these boxes.

Every page template will have additional hints and tips to read. Many of the templates will have themes you can use. Nevertheless, you can mix and match if you want. This is your project, so go to town!

When replacing pictures in these templates, consider using pictures that are similar in size to maintain the integrity of the template design.



This template is designed for news and community as well as newsletter purposes.

Naturally, if you decide to use this or any other template for any other purpose, you most certainly can do that as well.

The neat thing about our templates is that you can mix and match them. If you find a template page from another category that works for you, then by all means, use it!

Use the zoom tools to see more of your page or get right down to exact placement and positioning of text and pictures.

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These template are 100% customizable. Don't like where a picture is located? Move it to another location. Want a different font? Change it. Want to change the size of the font? Do so.

If your story will run over into another page, make sure you place a "Continued on Page 99" at the end of the column.

Color projects will print in gray scale easily.
