On the marring of Sunday 17th April, we resched a place of great interest. It was a wide but shallow index, the introducing dropped anchor off a line handland sovered with sond duren. The great number of stingings cought that

mercing prompted me to rather uncreatively name this place "Uniques Harbow".

Arrund functions we lifted archer and stilled the Endouser into the inlet. On either headland, we saw nations.

Soon ofter we dropped oncher opsin, a number of fellow scilers and myself set out in a rowtout to investigate. As we drifted toward the story I said to sollow look Smith, 'Jump out, luste,' thus moting him the first European to set fout on the filbled east sount of New Holland. We all soon followed and weeked Unrough the shallow, norm water to the place.
