**Race to the Bottom** LaFleur Stephens-Dougan, 2020-07-31 African American voters are a key demographic to the modern Democratic base and conventional wisdom has it that there is political cost to racialized dog whistles especially for Democratic candidates However politicians from both parties and from all racial backgrounds continually appeal to negative racial attitudes for political gain Challenging what we think we know about race and politics LaFleur Stephens Dougan argues that candidates across the racial and political spectrum engage in racial distancing or using negative racial appeals to communicate to racially moderate and conservative whites the overwhelming majority of whites that they will not disrupt the racial status quo Race to the Bottom closely examines empirical data on racialized partisan stereotypes to show that engaging in racial distancing through political platforms that do not address the needs of nonwhite communities and charged

rhetoric that targets African Americans immigrants and others can be politically advantageous Racialized communication persists as a well worn campaign strategy because it has real electoral value for both white and black politicians seeking to broaden their coalitions Stephens Dougan reveals that claims of racial progress have been overstated as our politicians are incentivized to employ racial prejudices at the expense of the most marginalized in our society *Resources in Education*, 2000-04

Joseph W. Byrns of Tennessee Ann B. Irish, 2001 Through painstaking research in archives across the nation Ann Irish has produced an illuminating portrait of one of modern Tennessee's most significant but least appreciated public figures Carroll Van West Middle Tennessee State University A thoroughly researched and gracefully written account of the man who served as Speaker of the U S House of Representatives during the critically important Second New Deal period This book will be of interest to students of Tennessee political history as well as scholars of reform in the twentieth century United States Roger Biles East Carolina University During a congressional career that lasted nearly three decades Joseph W Byrns 1869 1936 exercised significant influence in Washington He served as chairman of both the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee and the House Appropriations Committee before becoming Speaker of the House in 1935 In this first full length biography Ann B Irish explores Byrnes's life and career detailing his achievements and assessing their impact After serving in the Tennessee General Assembly from 1895 to 1901 Byrns was elected to Congress in 1909 He was involved in tariff issues World War I expenditures economic development of impoverished areas and farm policy As a longtime senior Democrat on the Appropriations Committee he played a major role in creating the first budget system for the United States government Ever responsive to the needs of his constituents Byrns strove during the Depression years for two urgent but somewhat contradictory goals a balanced budget and relief for the needy In 1932 he was instrumental in defeating a proposed federal sales tax During Franklin D Roosevelt's first term Byrns was House Majority Leader for two years then Speaker As a moderate southern Democrat he privately questioned some of Roosevelt's programs but nevertheless embraced the New Deal out of party loyalty He introduced the bill creating the Civilian Conservation Corps and successfully maneuvered other major New Deal initiatives through Congress His sudden death in 1936 cut short his career at the very point when he was most influential Drawing on extensive and meticulous research Irish shows how Byrns's political skills as well as his reputation for fairness and consideration helped propel him into the House leadership Her biography of this long neglected figure will prove a valuable addition to the political history of both Tennessee and the nation The Author A retired high school teacher and distant relative of Joseph Byrns Ann B Irish holds a doctorate in history from the University of Washington She lives on Vashon Island Washington

*Mixed Messages* Stefanie Mollborn, 2017-02-14 Sex is bad Unprotected sex is a problem Having a baby would be a disaster Abortion is a sin Teenagers in the United States hear conflicting messages about sex from everyone around them How do teens understand these messages In *Mixed Messages* Stefanie Mollborn examines how social norms and social control work through in depth interviews with college students and teen mothers and fathers revealing the tough conversations teenagers just can't have with adults Delving into teenagers' complicated social worlds Mollborn argues that by creating informal social sanctions like gossip and exclusion and formal communication such as sex education families peers schools and communities strategize to gain control over teens' behaviors However while teens strategize to keep control they resist the constraints of the norms revealing the variety of outcomes that occur beyond compliance or deviance By showing that the norms existing today around teen sex are ineffective failing to regulate sexual behavior and instead punishing teens that violate them Mollborn calls for a more thoughtful and consistent dialogue between teens and adults emphasizing messages that will lead to more positive health outcomes

*Taking Stock of Programs to Develop Socioemotional Skills* Maria Laura Sánchez Puerta, Alexandria Valerio, Marcela Gutiérrez Bernal, 2016-08-17 This book represents a systematic review of the documented impacts of programs aimed at fostering socio emotional skills in developed and developing countries It uses a life cycle approach to organize the findings from rigorous evaluations of more than 80 programs This includes programs for toddlers and young children before primary school programs for students enrolled in formal education and programs targeted at the out of school population The book develops a conceptual framework that helps to identify the program characteristics and participants' profiles associated with a range of program outcomes These include health related behavioral academic or cognitive and economic related outcomes The review finds that few of the programs studied focus exclusively on the development of socio emotional skills In fact most efforts to develop socio emotional skills are embedded within innovative education and training curricula as well as pedagogical and classroom practices Evidence shows that programs are
