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How It's Made: All About Ice Cream

Ice cream is one of the most popular desserts in America. It is bought and consumed in grocery stores and at ice cream shops and restaurants across the country. Despite its popularity, many people do not know all the steps involved in actually making ice cream.

Milk is the key ingredient in ice cream. There are federal regulations regarding the ingredients for any product labeled as ice cream. It must contain at least 10% milkfat. Many ice creams contain a higher percentage of milkfat, which makes the ice cream creamier. The milkfat content can also affect the color and texture of the ice cream. Ice cream labeled gourmet or super premium always contains a minimum of 12% milkfat, and often the percentage is higher.

To achieve ice cream's signature sweet taste, sweeteners are used. The most common is sugar, but ice creams may also be sweetened with beet sugar, corn syrup, or honey. Large ice crystals can form so stabilizers are used to prevent this, and they also make the ice cream smoother. To ensure that the ice cream stays a desirable texture in the freezer emulsifiers are used.

On a large scale, the ingredients in ice cream are blended in a mixing tank. For safety, it must be pasteurized, meaning it is heated to kill bacteria. Then the heated ice cream mixture enters a device called a homogenizer where the pressure exerted by the machine causes the milkfat to break down and maintain the smooth and creamy texture. The ice cream is cooled to around 40°F and freezes. As it freezes, it is mixed by revolving blades called "dashers" to keep the ice cream's ingredients mixed well. Federal regulations stipulate that ice cream must weight at least 4.5 pounds per gallon. Thus, manufacturers ensure that their ice cream has a light texture but not too much air. Finally, if the flavor includes chocolate chips, nuts, and bits of fruit or small candies they are added. After being packed, the ice cream is frozen at extremely cold temperatures in a "hardening room". The ice cream is now ready to be sold or distributed to a seller.
