Cervical Cord Syndromes



- Neck
- upper extremities
- lower extremities

- Most commonly caused by a **traumatic** injury
- Symptoms at thoracic level are present in the L5, while the L5 level of spine is **unimpaired**
- symptoms in upper extremities**

Thoracic Cord Syndromes



- Neck
- upper extremities

- Most commonly caused by a **traumatic** or **vascular** injury
- Complete loss of pain & temperature sensation at **thoracic** level below the level of injury
- Sensorimotor impairment in **lower extremities**

Lumbar Cord Syndromes



- Neck
- upper extremities
- lower extremities

- Most commonly caused by **damage to the thoracic vertebrae**
- Complete loss of pain & temperature sensation at **thoracic** level below the level of injury
- Sensorimotor impairment in **lower extremities**

Cauda Equina Syndrome



- Neck
- upper extremities
- lower extremities

- Caused by **damage to the cauda equina** in the **lumbar** or **sacral** region
- Loss of **bladder** or **rectal** sensation
- Complete loss of pain & temperature sensation at **thoracic** level below the level of injury

Conus Medullaris Syndrome



- Neck
- upper extremities
- lower extremities

- Most commonly caused by **traumatic** injury
- bilaterally** loss of motor function, **sensory**, **reflexes**, **temperature**, **bladder** and **rectal** sensation
- Complete loss of pain & temperature sensation at **thoracic** level below the level of injury

Conus Medullaris Syndrome

- Loss of **bladder** or **rectal** sensation

The ASIA Impairment Scale is a standardized neurological examination used to assess motor & sensory impairment following a spinal cord injury.
