

Clinical Placement Survival Guide

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Focused Assessment – Gastrointestinal System

Subjective Assessment

Any change in appetite?

- Is this change a loss in appetite?
- Any change in weight? How much gained/lost?
- Over what time has this occurred?

Any difficulty swallowing?

- When did you first notice this?

Are there any foods you can't eat?

- What happens if you do eat them?
- Do you use antacids? How often?

Do you have abdominal pain?

- Where is the pain?
- Does the pain radiate anywhere?
- Is the pain constant or does it come and go?
- Does the pain occur before or after eating?
- Character – cramp, burning, stabbing, aching?
- Is the pain relieved by anything?
- What makes the pain worse?
- What have you tried to relieve the pain?

Any nausea or vomiting?

- How often?
- How much do you vomit approximately (mL)?
- What color is the vomit? Is there blood?
- Any other symptoms?
- What foods have you eaten in the past 24 hrs?

How often do you have a bowel movement?

- What is the color and consistency?
- Any diarrhea or constipation?
- Any new changes in bowel habits?

Any history of ulcers, gallbladder disease, hepatitis, appendicitis, colitis, or abdominal operations?

Objective Assessment

Mouth – color, symmetry, swelling, gums, teeth, ulcers, rashes, bleeding

Tongue – coating, swelling, ulcers, breath odors

Pharynx – color, uvular deviation, lesions, plaque

Abdomen – color, symmetry, bulges, lesions, scars, rashes, masses, shape, contour, umbilicus, texture

Mouth – tenderness, lumps, lesions

Abdomen – gently depress skin about 1.5 cm, soft, tender, masses, rigidity, resistance

*If pt's abdomen is rigid, do not palpate

Abdomen – tympany or dullness, hollow organs like empty stomach or bowel = tympany, solid organs like liver, kidney, and feces-filled bowel = dullness

Abdomen – *auscultate abdomen before palpating or percussing; start at RLQ and move clockwise, note character, quality, heps or hyperactive sounds
