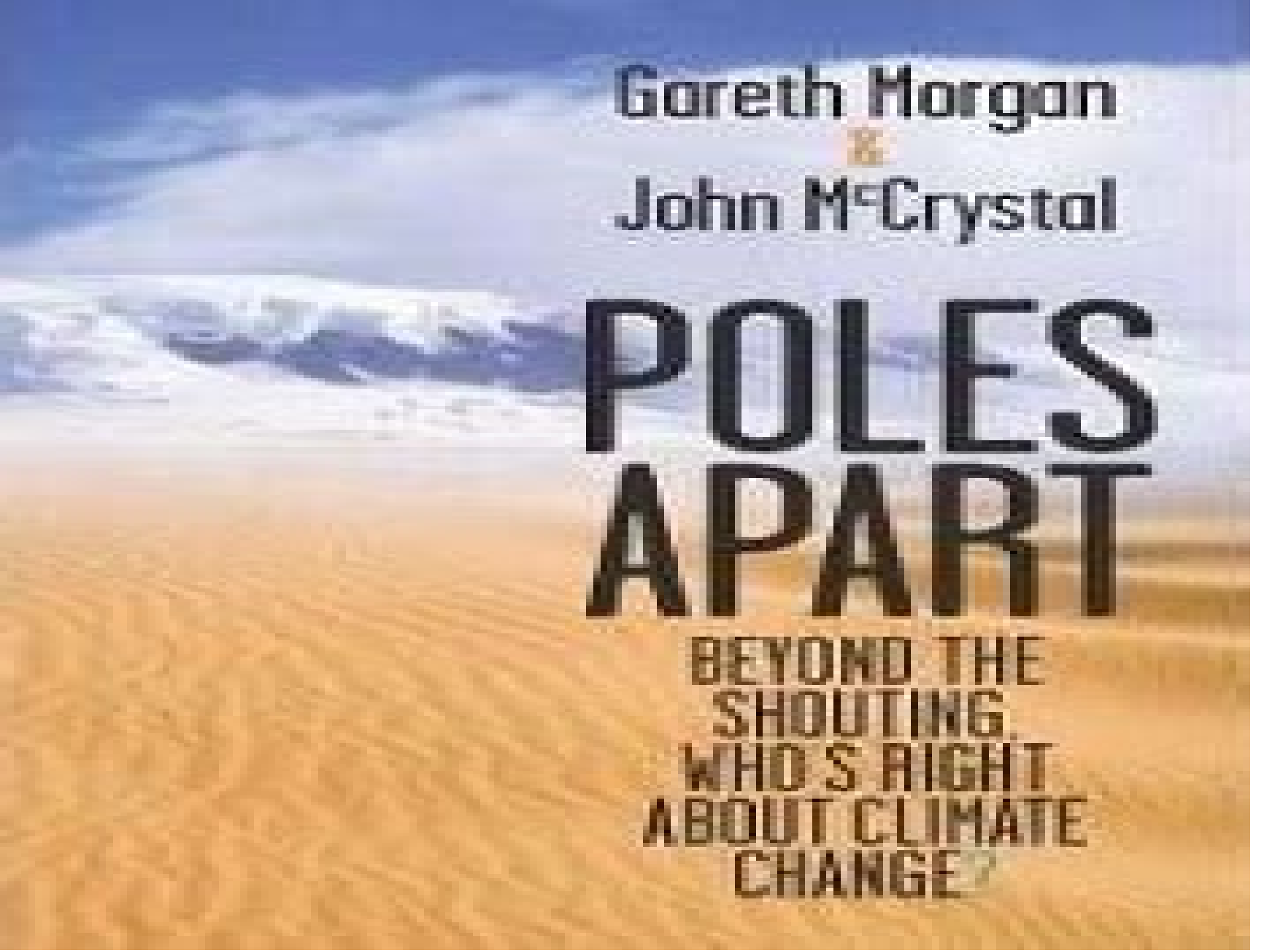

nations to agree on a single protocol is doomed to failure The book offers a novel contribution to our understanding of this failure and suggests alternative frameworks and policies to tackle what is arguably the most complex political issue of our time

The Bias That Divides Us Keith E. Stanovich,2021-08-31 A provocative timely analysis that asks What does science tells us about the bias that poisons our politics We don t live in a post truth society but a myside society in which no one can agree on accepted truth and facts In The Bias That Divides Us psychologist Keith Stanovich argues provocatively that we don t live in a post truth society as has been claimed but rather a myside society Our problem is not that we are unable to value and respect truth and facts but that we are unable to agree on commonly accepted truth and facts We believe that our side knows the truth Post truth That describes the other side The inevitable result is political polarization Stanovich shows what science can tell us about myside bias how common it is how to avoid it and what purposes it serves Stanovich explains that although myside bias is ubiquitous it is an outlier among cognitive biases It is unpredictable Intelligence does not inoculate against it and myside bias in one domain is not a good indicator of bias shown in any other domain Stanovich argues that because of its

outlier status myside bias creates a true blind spot among the cognitive elite those who are high in intelligence executive functioning or other valued psychological dispositions They may consider themselves unbiased and purely rational in their thinking but in fact they are just as biased as everyone else Stanovich investigates how this bias blind spot contributes to our current ideologically polarized politics connecting it to another recent trend the decline of trust in university research as a disinterested arbiter

What Should Individuals Do about Climate Change? Marion Hourdequin, Dan C. Shaha, 2025-06-10

Climate change is a pressing problem Does each of us have a moral responsibility to help tackle it In this volume Marion Hourdequin and Dan Shaha debate the timely issue of individual behavior and climate change examining what it takes to live morally in a warming world Hourdequin argues there are important reasons for people to translate their concerns about climate change into actions in their personal lives This includes attending to the many ways a single individual can help catalyze systemic change through choices about voting and political participation food and clothing energy use travel and so on Shaha disagrees because he endorses moral specialization and division of labor in a world filled with many problems He argues we should not expect everyone to take action on every serious issue rather it is acceptable and even desirable for people to focus on certain issues and decline to act on others including climate change The two authors take turns responding to each other and then defending their ultimate conclusions This volume is sure to draw attention to the question of individual choice in climate change debates and to help clarify some of the best thinking on this issue

The Government is failing to clearly and effectively communicate climate science to the public There is little evidence of coordination amongst Government government agencies and public bodies on communicating climate science despite various policies at national and regional level to mitigate and adapt to climate change The mandate to act on climate can only be maintained if the electorate are convinced that the Government is acting on the basis of strong scientific evidence Ministers therefore need to do more to demonstrate that is the case and consistently reflect the Government approach in all their communications especially with the media The report also criticises the BBC for its reporting on the issue It points out that BBC News teams continue to make mistakes in their coverage of climate science by giving opinions and scientific fact the same weight The BBC is called to develop clear editorial guidelines

for all commentators and presenters on the facts of climate that should be used to challenge statements from either side of the climate policy debate that stray too far from the scientific facts It is important that climate science is presented separately from any subsequent policy response Government should work with the learned societies and national academies to develop a source of information on climate science that is discrete from policy delivery comprehensible to the general public and responsive to both current developments and uncertainties in the science
