



Vomiting, with its precursor warning signs of nausea and retching, is mainly a protective reflex, but also an important symptom.

Chronic vemiting causes severe disorders. The vemiting center, located in the medulla oblongata, is reached, among others, via chemoreceptors of the area postrema on the bottom of the 4th ventricle (chemoreceptor trigger zone [CTZ]), where the blood-brain barrier is less tight. CTZ is activated by dopamine agonists such as apomorphine (therapeutic emetic), by numerous drugs or toxins, for example, digitalis glycosides, nicotine, staphylococcal enterotoxins as well as hypoxia, uremia, and modification. diabetes Title
