- What to know about - **Heavy Work**

Definition: Heavy work is any activity that involves pushing, pulling, or carrying. It gives our bodies what they need to improve attention and focus and makes us calm.

Heavy work can be completed before, after, or during a task to help increase sensory regulation and attention.

Examples of Heavy Work:

- Carrying groceries
- Carrying the laundry basket
- Moving furniture
- Pushing a stroller filled with toys
- Cleaning windows and floors
- Laid push-ups
- Pull a wagon
- Push something on a swing
- Pushing a shopping cart



- How To Develop - **Ocular Motor Skills**

Definition: Ocular Motor Skills are the ability to use eye movements to engage in everyday tasks and activities.

A child with oculomotor difficulties may exhibit frequent head movements, jerky eye movements, and have poor balance. Ocular motor difficulties are often correlated with sensory deficits.

Activities to Improve Ocular Motor Skills

- Follow a flashlight on a wall with your eyes
- Balance a ping pong ball and catch it in a cup
- Trace and catch a ball
- High fives with your hand and fingers
- Dot in basketball
- Play Simon Says
- Load train bridge in blocks
- Play tag
