The origins of the first constellations date back to prehistoric times. Their purpose was to tell stories of their beliefs, experiences, creation, or mythology. There cognition of constellations has changed over time. They varied in size or shape, others became popular and then were forgotten, and some were limited to a single culture.

In the 20th century, a committee of the International Astronomical Union took it upon itself to accurately delineate the 88 constellations. It included 48 ancient constellations enumerated by the Greek astronomer Ptolemy, plus 40 new constellations. Each constellation is a region of the sky, and together they cover the entire celestial sphere.

These 88 constellations divide the entire night sky as seen from Earth. Star maps are made from the brightest stars, and the patterns they form give rise to all the constellation names.

The star charts represent the position of the stars as we see them from Earth; however, the stars in each constellation may not be close to each other, as some we perceive to be brighter because they are close to the Earth, while others are brighter because they are huge stars.

Not all constellations are visible from any point on Earth, so star maps are divided between the northern and southern hemispheres.
