Signal words

★ Same, different, both, in contrast

Cause/Effect:



Reasons why, effects of, as a result.

The author explains why/how something happened, and the results (effects).

Problem/Solution:

The author tells about a problem and gives one or more possible solutions.



Problem, solved, dilemma

Chronology:

The author describes events in order: uses time words.



First, next, then, last, finally
