- Is automatic in operation: Qua work with minimum or no human intervention.
- Can accept data: data can be entered into the computer through various means and the computer accepts it.
- Can store data and programs: Data and programs entered into the computer can be stored for future use.
- ✓ Can process duty into information.

Data and Information

- Dags: enforce to raw facts and figures of an activity. It can just be a list of numbers, names or a combination of these. Data is meaningless and needs to be processed. Data cannot be used for decision making purposes as it is meaningless.
- 2. Information: It is dute that has been converted into meaningful form. In general it is processed data. Information can be understood and therefore can be used for decision making purposes. Information is meaningful. To get relevant information, data extend into the computer must be relevant, accurate and up-to-date. If data entered into the computer is wong (Garbage In) the results will also be wong (Garbage Out), and is generally referred to as Garbage-In Garbage-Out (GRGO). It is a rule stating that the quality of the output is a function of the quality of the input; put garbage in and you get garbage out. Therefore the accuracy of the results produced by the computer depends on how accounts the user enters data, functions, formulae and codes program procedures.

Computer Generations

Refers to stages through which computes developed from the 1940s to date. These are as follows:

1. First Generation Computers (1945 -1955): These are the endiest computes that used valves in controlling machines, e.g. EDVAC, ACE and UNIVAC machines. These were very large computes, fitting about the size of an average mon. They were programmed in a language understandable by the machine. Such computers used a lot of electricity and were very expensive to purchase. Only very large organisation could afford these computers.
