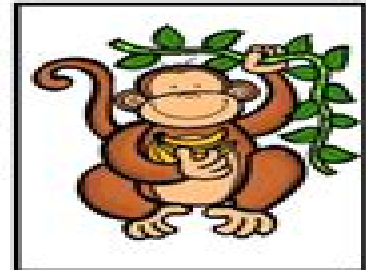


# Monkeyin' Around
