Position Paper

The position paper format that will be used in this simulation will have 5 parts; the heading; introductory paragraph explaining the topic you are debating; how your country is affected or not by the problem; the solutions that have been used to solve the problems and the ones your delegation propose; and finally the sources where you got all the information. The position paper has to be no longer than one page and a half with Arial 12 and 1.5 spacing.

The Heading

Different models use different types of heading, but the one that you will use is the following: Committee: (You should put the name of your committee, no abbreviations)

Country: (The country you are representing)

Topic: (The complete topic you are adjourning. For example, if you are discussing Heath Care in the Conflict Zones of the Middle East, you have to write the complete name of the topic and not Health in the Middle East)

Delegate: (Your complete name)

School: (Your school's complete name)

Introductory paragraph

Here is where you will briefly explain what the problem is in general terms. This will help everyone in the committee understand the topic they will discuss during the sessions. You can write definitions, statistics or anything you think will help everyone get the context of the situation, but this paragraph cannot be too long.

Your country's relation with the topic

In this paragraph you will have to give arguments of how the topic of the committees is affecting or not affecting your country. Include the policies or laws your country has about the problem and its reason to or not to have them. You can write a phrase a leader from the country you are representing said, but only if it has to do with the topic. Statistics can be used to back up your country's laws or reasons. Use anything you think is necessary to explain how your country is involved in the committee's topic, this are a few examples.

Solutions

The final paragraph is where you state the solutions your delegations or the United Nations have made and the solutions your country is proposing. Explain how your delegation is planning to accomplish those solutions and say how your delegation is considering financing it.

The sources

You should enlist all the websites, books, magazines or any other source you used to make your position paper, using MLA or APA format.
