## **No Boundaries Aborigin:**

Aboriginal Art and Australian Society Laura Fisher, 2016-05-30 This book is an investigation of the way the Aboriginal art phenomenon has been entangled with Australian society's negotiation of Indigenous people's status within the nation. Through critical reflection on Aboriginal art's idiosyncrasies as a fine arts movement its vexed relationship with money and its mediation of the politics of identity and recognition this study illuminates the mutability of Aboriginal art's meanings in different settings. It reveals that this mutability is a consequence of the fact that a range of governmental activist and civil society projects have appropriated the art's vitality and metonymic power in national public culture and that Aboriginal art is as much a phenomenon of visual and commercial culture as it is an art movement. Throughout these examinations Fisher traces the utopian and dystopian currents of thought that have crystallised around the Aboriginal art movement and which manifest the ethical conundrums that underpin the settler state condition.

She explains how she became aware of her team of spirit guides who provide unwavering support and unconditional love through each of life's struggles. She shares the tenderness of her husband's final moments and how she worked past her grief to transform her relationship with him enabling him to become an active loving part of her spirit team and partner in her healing work.

Aboriginal and Treaty Rights in Canada Michael Asch, 2007-10-01 In the last two decades there has been positive change in how the Canadian legal system defines Aboriginal and treaty rights. Yet even after the recognition of those rights in the Constitution Act of 1982 the legacy of British values and institutions as well as colonial doctrine still shape how the legal system identifies and interprets Aboriginal and treaty rights.

What results is a systematic bias in the legal system that places Indigenous peoples at a distinct disadvantage. The eight essays in *Aboriginal and Treaty Rights in Canada* focus on redressing this bias. All of them apply contemporary knowledge of historical events as well as current legal and cultural theory in an attempt to level the playing field. The book highlights rich historical information that previous scholars may have overlooked. Of particular note are data relevant to better understanding the political and legal relations established by treaty and the Royal Proclamation of 1763. Other essays include discussion of such legal matters as the definition of Aboriginal rights and the privileging of written over oral testimony in litigation. The collection also includes an essay that by means of ethnographic and historical data raises concerns respecting how the law might be distorted even further if we are not careful in assuring that what is defined as Indigenous today is detached from its own traditions and divorced from contemporary issues. In sum, *Aboriginal and Treaty Rights in Canada* shows that changes in the way in which these rights are conceptualized and interpreted are urgently needed.
