Wolfitt's touring dates throughout Great Britain and North America this volume also demonstrates theatre's importance as a source of mass entertainment and education as well as a propaganda tool. Despite Wolfitt's popular appeal at the time he was doomed to remain on the periphery of the theatrical establishment. This book contends that Wolfitt deserves to be recognized for his efforts in maintaining public morale during times of stress.
