Chapter 4 Close Reading Questions for Individuals or Groups

This guide can be used as students read Chapter 4 together in a group, or after a reading assignment for the chapter.

This activity can be used individually or in groups. I use this assignment for pairs of students; it seems to work better than with larger groups. Students will need to use their texts and dictionaries. This activity is designed for no more than one 40-minute class period to complete the entire worksheet, which we then review together for less than one additional class period. In the interest of time, questions could be split among pairs of students, with each pair teaching the others, or a class or by rotating one student from each pair throughout the class for sharing of each pair's answers. I distribute one worksheet per person so notes can be taken. Because my students use copies of the novel purchased for them to keep, they are also encouraged to annotate and highlight as they discover answers, and to point out to others where they found their answers in the text.

This activity allows students to begin to perceive the characterization of Chillingworth and to add to their perceptions about Hester and even the baby, Pearl. They will discover, through this activity, that Hawthorne lends deep complexity and great breadth to characters through many means, including speech, descriptions, and actions, and through the biased observations of the third-person omniscient narrator.
