## Introduction

The ethical considerations related to death have been at the center of the discussion of philosophers, policy-makers, health care providers, and other representatives of the involved spheres for many years. On the one hand, death is perceived as a phenomenon that does not depend on a person; on the other hand, it is considered by many to be a subject of human will and occurs when desired if one deals with their own life. Such ambiguity in views is influenced by the differences in human values, needs, religious affiliations, and culturally constructed beliefs. The concept of the voluntary ending of life is considered a tabu on a general scale. In order to meet the needs and respect the rights to the free will of such individuals, several countries of the world have enacted specially designed laws that enable the voluntary ending of life in the form of physician-assisted suicide.

In this literature review, the current viewpoints on the ethical considerations behind the legality of physician-assisted suicide will be discussed and critically analyzed. The paper argues that physician-assisted suicide should be a legal procedure for specific groups of people, whose desire to end their lives voluntarily is influenced by medically approved reasons.
