During the 24 years since the publication of the first edition the editors have observed vast developments in theories as well as the assessment methodology of food texture both sensory and instrumental and these have shaped our understanding This second edition brings the science up to date by introducing topics not previously covered e g psychophysics tribology oral processing texture maps and special foods for dysphagia patients It includes an expos of the instruments to measure food texture and also considers techniques for measuring consumer perception of food texture in addition to the sensory properties Additionally it amends omissions from the first edition such as dairy products fish bakery products and sugar confectionery asproduct groups All in all it is expanded and updated in its coverage of food texturology as a coherent scientific discipline

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
