3. Disparagement—n. the act of degrading or belittling, something that casts a bad light; *I would not for the wealth of all this town; Here in my house do him disparagement (Act I, scene v)*
4. Galling—adj. very irritating, vexing, bitter; *What is it else? A madness most discreet, A choking gall, and a preserving sweet (Act I, scene i)*
5. Partisan—n. A weapon having a blade with lateral projections mounted on the end of a long shaft, used chiefly in the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> centuries ; one who exhibits extreme allegiance to a group; *Clubs, bills, and partisans! Strike! beat them down! (Act I scene i)*
