Caring for Caregivers aims to support family or friends that are providing care for adults 60 and older. Focusing on What Matters to the caregiver, we assist in developing a plan for the caregivers' health and well-being that incorporates the care needs of the older adult.

- Skill Building Meetings can include occupational therapists, nurses, pharmacists, or nutritionists in teaching skills to caregivers, such as transferring patients without injuring themselves or performing basic medical care.
- Planning for What Matters Sessions with our social worker to discuss what matters most to both caregiver and care recipient and develop health and life plans that reflect your preferences.
- Care Team Planning Meetings involve learning to create and work with care teams most effectively, focusing on communicating effectively and ensuring that older adults and their caregivers are included in planning for care.

Initial session is provided at no cost. Additional services are covered by most insurances. Support for Rush Caring for Caregivers is made available through a generous grant from the RRF Foundation for Aging.
