Regulating oneself and managing time is the next necessary step for successfully following through with a created plan to reach an academic goal. There are three circulatory steps to regulating oneself that include forethought, performance, and self-evaluation. The forethought step goes back to the goal setting from the previous step, it is setting short-term and long-term goals for oneself. The next step is performance, in this step one would carry out strategies and check their learning. After both of these steps the next would be self-evaluation, and in this last step one would examine how effective the strategies they used were in comparison to achieving their goal. The cycle begins back over after examining which strategies worked best and moving forward with the plan of using those successful strategies (Thibodeaux, Deutsch, Kitsantas, & Winsler, 2017). Through constant cycling any student should be able to find a successful strategy for them to achieve success.

Approaching these things with no clue of how to handle them can lead to health issues and academic failure.
