Students will begin class with solving the problem of the day with the general education teacher Mrs. Louk (Special education teacher assists students D, L, and M during beginning of class) 2. Questions Students will be given the opportunity to ask any questions they may have about division before we split into stations. 3. Split students into 4 groups to prepare for stations: Give students a record sheet; go over each station before students move. Explain to the students that their record sheet is where they will be recording all their answers to turn in at the end of the class period. (Each station should be about 10-12
