

There is widespread disagreement on what poverty is, what the best measure is, and what the immense quantity of data we have on poverty means. Poverty in the United States today has many faces and is difficult to define. There's the middle-aged man on a city street holding up a sign begging for his next meal. There's the face of a young child in a school somewhere, whose only real meal today will be a free school lunch. There's the sad face of a single mother who doesn't have enough money to buy clothes for her children. And there's the frustrated face of a man working at a minimum-wage job who can't afford to pay rent.

According to the Census Bureau poverty is defined as a state or condition in which a person or community lacks the financial resources and essentials to enjoy a minimum standard of life and well-being that's considered acceptable in society. There are two common measure of poverty in the United States. One is a poverty threshold based on income levels, set by the Department of Health and Human Services. Another is the poverty line which is a measurement based on a minimum amount required to support an average family of given composition at the lowest level consistent with standards of living prevailing in US.

The War on Poverty is the name for the legislation first introduced by United States President Lyndon B. Johnson during his State of the Union address on January 8, 1964. This legislation was proposed by Johnson in response to a national poverty rate of around nineteen percent. The speech led the United States
