Defines the research questions, objectives, and specific issues. Focuses on clearly presenting and discussing the goals in addressing the problem.

## 4 Methodology

Describes the data analysis system, data collection methods, tools, and research participants. It outlines the approach to be used in conducting the research

## 5 Timeline

Includes a well-defined timeline estimate for the project, specifying the duration in months and years.

## 6 References

Provides a comprehensive list of all sources cited in the concept paper, including books, journals, articles, and other resources used for the research.
