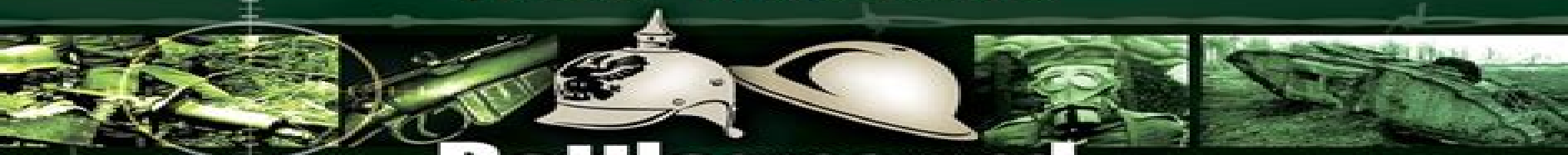

Retreat Of I Corps 1914 Battleground:

Retreat of I Corps 1914 Jerry Murland, 2014-09-30 On 23 August 1914 it was only the two divisions of General Smith Dorrien's II Corps that were directly engaged with the German First Army along the line of the Mons Conde Canal. As the British Expeditionary Force withdrew from Mons and bivouacked around Bavay on 25 August, Sir John French and his GHQ advisors, unsure of the condition of the routes through the Fort de Mormal, ordered the British Expeditionary Force to continue their retirement the next day and to avoid the 35 square miles of forest roads. Consequently, II Corps used the roads to the west of the Fort de Mormal and Sir Douglas Haig's I Corps those to the east with the intention that the four divisions should meet again at Le Cateau. It was an intention that was ambushed by circumstance as I Corps encountered units of the German 7th Division at Landrecies on 25-26 August. Unsure of the weight of the German attack at Landrecies, Douglas Haig hurriedly left for Grand Fayt and ordered his two divisions to immediately begin their retirement along a route that would take them west of Le Cateau. It was this decision that kept the by now five divisions of the BEF apart until 1 September and is the subject of this book. I Corps was now coming under attack from the German Second Army and the resulting rearguard actions that Haig's men were involved in are covered in this volume. *The Retreat from Mons 1914: North* Jon

of St Valery-en-Caux 1940 Jerry Murland, 2024-06-30 Supported by eleven maps and over 150 photographs, this is the story of Scottish Troops fighting for survival in Normandy. The story of the 51st Highland Division during 1939 and 1940 is a short and largely tragic one and although it firmly burnt itself into the minds of Scotsmen, it has never been granted the recognition it deserves. Even in Scotland, it is often forgotten that the men and attached troops of the 51st Division were fighting for survival in Normandy for some ten days after the evacuation from Dunkerque had been completed. Most present-day accounts of the Second World War in 1939-40 deal with the Phoney War and the evacuation from Dunkerque but few mention the rearguard action at St Valery-en-Caux other than a passing mention. Nevertheless, the action of the 51st Division against the might of German forces won the admiration of General Erwin Rommel and Charles De Gaulle who fought against

and alongside them One of the enduring beliefs is that Churchill deliberately sacrificed the 51st Division in an attempt to keep France in the war this apart from being palpably incorrect fails miserably to address the intricacy of the circumstances that overtook the 51st Division after they returned from the Saar In a situation where units were repeatedly changing affiliation communication between the French Supreme Command and British forces suffered language difficulties and the inclination to blame each other for the debacle that inevitably ensued Nevertheless for all the criticism that is thrown at the French Army it is clear that a number of French units fought hard and with great courage the main fault with the French command lying with poor leadership and lack of tactical planning As far as the Highlanders were concerned it was bad luck that their term of duty on the Saar coincided with the beginning of Fall Rot The speed and extent of the German advance from Abbeville took their own High Command and the French by surprise and it was with little wonder that Allied military thinking failed to keep up with actions on the battlefield The theory that Churchill sacrificed the division to keep the French in the war owes a great deal to the Scottish need to attribute all the misery of the world to one scoundrel a trait that exists to this day Supported by eleven maps and over 150 photographs the book traces the history of the 51st Division from its inception until its final surrender at St Valery en Caux and deals with the fighting on the Saar and the often ragged skirmishing though Normandy The book also touches on the actions of the 1st armored Division and the Battle of Abbeville There are three walks and a car tour included in this volume which allows the battlefield visitor to base themselves firstly in Abbeville and secondly further into Normandy

Battleground Europe titles covering this highly significant battle of spring 1918 The German offensive in Flanders in April 1918 came close to catastrophe for the British Armies but ultimately ended in strategic defeat for the Kaisers men Following close on the heels of the devastating Operation Michael attack in March which had been aimed against the British front on the Somme and Arras this offensive Operation Georgette was aimed at strangling the vital railways and roads that supplied the British at Ypres and threatening the vital logistics links with the Channel Ports Having assembled an overwhelming numerical advantage the Germans attacked in thick fog on 9 April 1918 By days end the Germans had succeeded in gaining a crossing of the River Lys and were well on their way to the railway junctions at Hazebrouck Next day they extended the attacked front northwards and advanced to the very gates of Ypres forcing a British retirement from the bloodily won advances during the Third Battle of Ypres Messines Ridge captured so spectacularly by the British in June 1917 was soon in German hands and fighting inched towards Mont Kemmel which dominated the Ypres front Once this fell the way was open for the capture of the main supply roads into Ypres To find sufficient reserves to counter the German attack the British took the heart breaking decision to abandon the ground won so dearly in the Passchendaele offensive in the summer and autumn of 1917 Gradually fresher British and French reserves arrived and held their ground With disappointing results mounting casualties and a diminishing return for their efforts the Germans paused to regroup Late in the month they unleashed a rapid unstoppable attack that captured Kemmel from the French forces that had been rushed north to reinforce the threatened line and which had been holding the summit one of the finest military feats of the Great War Behind the scenes however the Germans were already calling off a continuation of the offensive and so by a seeming miracle the bastion that was Ypres remained in British hands What the British call The Battle of the Lys 1918 is a fascinating yet curiously neglected period of military history Chris Baker examines this major battle from the strategic down to the platoon level highlighting the key events characters and acts of enormous bravery on both sides both in historical narrative and in a series of tours of the area This volume concentrates on the northern half of the battlefield nearly all of the actions described in this volume took place in Belgium

Footsteps of the Fallen Christina Holstein, 2019-07-30 Fully illustrated with photographs and maps this guide to the WWI battlefield of Verdun offers a deeper understanding of its history and its monuments A visit to the battlefield of Verdun is usually dominated by the forts of Douaumont and Vaux the museum at Fleury and the striking Ossuary Although this gives a flavor of the horrific fighting that took place in the area during the Great War the visitor who explores no further will have only skimmed the surface of this deeply fascinating site This book seeks to guide the battlefield pilgrim on a series of walks that combine major sites with parts that are rarely visited These four walking tours have been thoroughly researched and feature many physical remnants of combat such as gun positions bunkers and trench systems the significance of which are fully explained They are carefully curated to give visitors a greater understanding of why the fighting developed as it did and why such places as Fort Vaux were so significant to both sides Though they vary in length most take a half day to complete while the longest and last takes a full day

Battle Story: Ypres 1914-1915 William E Fowler, 2011-09-30 Ypres was a medieval town known for its textiles however it became infamous during the Great War with trench warfare poison gas and many thousands of casualties As the German Army advanced through Belgium it failed to take the Ypres Salient On 13 October 1914 German troops entered Ypres On looting the city the Germans retreated as the British Expeditionary Force advanced On 22 November 1914 the Germans commenced a huge artillery barrage killing many civilians In 1917 the Third Battle of Ypres commenced making it an exceptionally dangerous place to live In 1918 a German major offensive was launched but the British held firm Ypres was finally safe in late September 1918 when German troops withdrew from the Salient Today the battlefields of Ypres contain the resting place of thousands of German and British soldiers This book explores the first and second battles of Ypres through narrative eye witness accounts and images

From the Channel to the Ypres Salient Chris Baker, 2021-10-31 The sector north of Ypres is best known for the inundation of much of the ground to the east of the Yser that acted as a block to the German advance in the autumn of 1914 From that time on military activities were extremely limited Much of this line was manned by Belgian troops with some assistance from the French army at its southern end and of the British army on the Channel coast The role of the Belgian army in the Great War is little known apart from the opening months when brave little Belgium held on to its important fortified cities notably Liege and Antwerp for longer than German planning had anticipated It was not until mid October 1914 that the Belgian army was forced back to the area of the Yser when its defences were bolstered by French troops whilst Haig's I Corps came up on its southern flank At this crucial phase of the campaign the harsh decision was taken to open the dykes at the end of October 1914 and thereby flooding much of the low lying ground east of the Yser and so effectively halting major German offensive operations For almost four years the Belgian army rested reasonably secure behind this sodden landscape although certain key points were the scene of frequent if limited tussles Free Belgium was reduced to two significant towns that could be regarded as secure and out of the range of most German artillery the coastal resort of La Panne De Panne and the much bigger settlement of

Furnes Veurne Over these years the Belgian army was rebuilt under the dynamic leadership of the king Albert I and by the time of the general allied advance in September 1918 the Belgian army was able to take its place in the Advance to Victory in an allied Army that was commanded by King Albert Although this phase of the war is outside the scope of the book it is important to realise that the Belgian army was a very active player in these last few months Amongst the achievements of Belgian troops at this stage of the war was the final capture of Passchendaele This book concerns itself with the years of defence and the reconstruction of the army behind the Yser Relatively little of Belgium s efforts in the Great War remained but recent years have seen action to preserve what does Most significant of these perhaps is the so called Trench of Death near Diksmuide Although always preserved it has recently been very successfully refurbished and is now most effectively and informatively presented Other remains from the war have also been developed so as to be more informative and the result is that touring this area provides a fascinating insight into one of the most unusual sectors of the Western Front and which is conveniently close to the much visited Ypres Salient In this book Chris Baker brings his extensive knowledge of the Belgian army helped by his ability to read French and Dutch and of the Flanders region to produce a much needed insight into Belgium s army role for most of the war as the protector of the northern flank of the whole of the Allied line **Ypres 1914:**

including detailed aerial photography of the battle in progress *The American Expeditionary Forces in WWI, Meuse-Argonne* Maarten Otte, 2018-11-30 Any visitor to the site of the bloodiest battle in the history of the United States will be drawn to Montfaucon for it is here that General Pershing the Commander in Chief determined that the major memorial to the American Expeditionary Forces would be sited The impressive classical column erected on the summit of Montfaucon Hill can be seen from many parts of the battlefield of the Meuse Argonne 1918 The village of Montfaucon perched on and around one of the most notable heights in the Argonne area was a first day objective for the First American Army in its massive offensive that was launched on 26 September 1918 and which rumbled on until the Armistice Montfaucon had been the scene of bitter fighting between the French and the Germans in the early stages of the war finally staying securely in German hands The attack started well with the great numbers of Doughboys easily moving through the first line of the German defense system and indeed good progress was made all along the front even if final objectives were not attained that would have brought the Americans up to the Hindenburg Line defenses The most notable setback was the failure to capture Montfaucon an objective given to the 79th Division Why the task of capturing this key part of the German line to a green division composed of draftees and which had only had six weeks or so of training time in France instead of the prescribed three months has never been adequately explained What has proved to be controversial ever since is why the 4th Division a regular formation that had already been engaged in battle on the Western Front and which gained its objectives on the first day did not seek to assist the 79th when it was clear that it was facing significant difficulties in overcoming the Montfaucon defenses The outcome was that the village and hill did not fall on the first day How significant this setback was to the success and the duration of the offensive has also been the subject of considerable discussion Montfaucon was an important observation point for much of the war providing distant views over considerable amounts of ground and thus invaluable for the German artillery How much its loss mattered to the Germans when fighting a defensive battle with the defense lines south of it already lost is more open to debate given the vantage points that the Germans continued to enjoy from high ground to the north west and east Maarten Otte sets the importance of Montfaucon and the ultimately successful effort to capture it within a succinct narrative In the tours section he takes the visitor on a number of routes so that they can see for themselves the problems on the ground that faced the 79th Division and puts Montfaucon in the context of the wider battle He also provides a detailed tour of the village and hill itself including the magnificent memorial and the preserved defenses and ruins which surround it **Frankforce and the Defence of Arras 1940** Jerry Murland, 2017-10-30 There is no other city in France that has the same associations in time of conflict that the British have with Arras Since the campaigns of John Churchill 1st Duke of Marlborough in the early 18th century British soldiers have fought in and around Arras occasionally as an enemy but more often as defenders of French and Allied democracy Battlefield visitors to the area will immediately recognize the names of towns and villages that were as significant to the men of Marlboroughs army as they were to those

who fought in the First and Second World Wars This book serves both as guide to the Second World War battlefields that surround the city and its environs as well as detailing the actions of the British armored attack of 21 May 1940 The book looks at the strategic situation that led up to the famous Arras counterstroke and using material that has not been published before examines the British and German actions between 20 and 23 May The only Victoria Cross action that took place during this time is looked at in detail as is the fighting that took place in Arras and during the breakout Despite its shortcomings the counterstroke achieved the essential element of surprise and caused widespread alarm amongst the German command and hit Rommels 7th Panzer Division at precisely the moment when his armored units were ahead of the infantry and gunners The British infantry fought well and both the Durham battalions were fortunate that their commanding officers and senior NCOs were men who had already fought in one conflict and possessed the determination to rally their less experienced junior ranks and fight on regardless Such was the case with the two tank battalions although sadly they lost both their commanding officers and over half the tanks that went into the engagement The attack did enable the British to tighten their hold on Arras albeit temporarily and as is often cited built doubts in the minds of German High Command as to the speed of their advance and contributed to the subsequent Hitler halt order of 24 27 May The author has gone to some lengths to track down accounts from those individuals who served in the area during May 1940 and fought the enveloping tide of the German advance The book is supported by three car tours one of which takes the visitor along the tragic path taken by the Tyneside Scottish on 20 May and two walking routes which concentrate on Arras 137 black and white photographs integrated and a number of maps derived from regimental histories and six tour maps provide the battlefield visitor with illustrations of the battlefields as they were in 1940 and as they are today

Paterson, 2022-05-05 A history of the latter portion of WWI s deadly Battle of the Somme featuring a guide for walking and driving around the historic sites Much of the popular attention on the Battle of the Somme 1916 is focussed on the first day of the infantry assault 1st July when such high hopes were dashed and British casualties ran into the tens of thousands However the Somme was a battle that lasted over twenty weeks running well into the autumn This book is concerned with fighting south of the famous Albert Bapaume road from mid September to the official end of the battle The coverage includes Martinpuich the hamlet of Eaucourt l Abbaye Le Sars and that strange topographical feature the Butte de Warlencourt The action starts with the major British attack of 15 September 1916 which enjoyed some success and which included the first use of tanks The book takes up the story from the fall of Martinpuich and follows the British as they inched their way north eastwards to Le Sars and Eaucourt l Abbaye This was gruelling warfare fought in fast deteriorating weather conditions and in the face of ever increasing volumes of artillery fire the mud was almost as much the enemy of both sides as the weight of lead and iron fired at them The Butte de Warlencourt has come to have an almost iconic status This rather insignificant hillock almost certainly a burial mound of the Romano Gallic period marks the point at which the battle officially ceased along the Albert Bapaume road For days before the battle ended both sides tussled to secure its possession numerous limited attacks taking place over devastated utterly water logged and featureless ground Indeed it was the emptiness of the area that made the Butte of such significance a fearsome solitary landmark standing out against a backdrop of desolation It was the focus of the fighting in the area for almost six weeks As well as the customary walks essential to an understanding of the confused fighting in the area there is a long car tour covering many less visited parts of the battlefield to the east and north of the

the 26th would have a similar outcome If so they were in for a rude awakening This book is profusely illustrated with contemporary photographs and numerous maps the narrative supplemented by a number of firsthand accounts the whole is supported by several walking and car tours
