They were men and women black and white fiercely devoted to causes that pitted them against mainstream America even while they fought to preserve the nation's founding ideals. The brilliant heiress Frances Wright whose shocking critiques of religion and the institution of marriage led to calls for her arrest, the radical Bostonian William Lloyd Garrison whose commitment to nonviolence would be tested as the conflict over slavery pushed the nation to its breaking point, the Philadelphia businessman James Forten who presided over the first mass political protest of free African Americans, Marx Lazarus a vegan from Alabama whose calls for sexual liberation masked a dark secret, black nationalist Martin Delany the would be founding father of a West African colony who secretly supported John Brown's treasonous raid on Harpers Ferry only to ally himself with Southern Confederates after the Civil War.
