Abstract

This research investigates various formation processes that have been developed by Far Right groups in response to the global health emergency crisis caused by COVID-19. An examination of statements by six organizations of the Identitarian and National Socialist movements published online over a two-month period revealed six "crisis frames" that have been evolved: migration, globalization, governance, freedom, resilience, and conspiracy. In addition to determining crisis frames applied by Far Right, this study has found that these Far Right groups emphasized involvement in activities aimed at nourishing community sustainability. It was further identified that conspiracy theories and disinformation practices were mostly absent. These findings imply that in the early stages of the COVID crisis, there was a shift by certain Far Right groups not to practices of encouraging violent disputes, but to using propaganda to highlight their contribution to supporting families, communities, and the nation, against the government's failure to fight the virus. This paper is a first step towards understanding the development of the modern "crisis frame" in the Far Right, focusing on the interactive processes that occur between Far Right groups, global events and the authorities.
