Mathematical Objective: Students will interpret data during line plots

Thinking about the students:

- Students have worked on fractions
- The majority of students demonstrate knowledge of rounding (we will be rounding the lengths of their feet to the nearest half inch)

Materials and Planning:

Rulers

Post-it notes

Paper to write their own line plot

Lesson

Before

Tell the kids we are going to gather up some data on feet size

During

Have kids go off to measure their own foot to the nearest half inch (model) and write down their measurement on a post-it note. After they measure, they can put their post-it note on the board.
