

# The 25 Most Common Occupational Therapy CPT Codes

*Please note: This information is current as of August 2021 and based on common procedure codes captured in Insight. Commercial payers may use different codes for claims.*

Most of the CPT codes for occupational therapy appear in the 9700 section (Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation) of the AMA's CPT code book, and share many of the same codes with physical therapists. Between January and July 2021, Clinicient's Insight platform recorded over 325,000 OT visits to determine the most common CPT codes for occupational therapy.
