Pula, 2019-05-07 The period of Sectionalism Civil War and Reconstruction was the most traumatic in American history The outcome changed the foundations of the nation with effects still felt today While most Civil War histories focus on specific topics military history economics politics this book presents the narrative as it unfolded against a broader historical background Drawing on direct quotations from actual participants the author provides an interpretive overview of the issues and events that divided and then devastated the United States

Southern Women Novelists and the Civil War Sharon Talley, 2014-04-09 During and after the Civil War southern women played a critical role in shaping the South's evolving collective memory by penning journals and diaries historical accounts memoirs and literary interpretations of the war While a few of these writings most notably Mary Chesnut's diaries and Margaret Mitchell's novel *Gone with the Wind* have been studied in depth by numerous scholars until now there has been no comprehensive examination of Civil War novels by southern women In this welcome study Sharon Talley explores works by fifteen such writers illuminating the role that southern women played in fashioning cultural identity in the region Beginning with Augusta Jane Evans's *Macaria* and Sallie Rochester Ford's *Raids and Romance of Morgan and His Men* which were published as the war still raged Talley offers a chronological consideration of the novels with informative introductions for each time period She examines Reconstruction works by Marion Harland Mary Ann Cruse and Rebecca Harding Davis novels of the Redeemed South and the turn of the century by Mary Noailles Murfree Ellen Glasgow and Mary Johnston and narratives by Evelyn Scott Margaret Mitchell and Caroline Gordon from the Modern period that spanned the two World Wars Analysis of Margaret Walker's *Jubilee* 1966 the first critically acclaimed Civil War novel by an African American woman of the South as well as other post World War II works by Kaye Gibbons Josephine Humphreys and Alice Randall offers a fitting conclusion to Talley's study by addressing the inaccuracies in the romantic myth of the Old South that *Gone with the Wind* most famously engraved on the nation's consciousness Informed by feminist poststructural and cultural studies theory Talley's close readings of these various novels ultimately refute the notion of a monolithic interpretation of the Civil War presenting instead unique and diverse approaches to balancing fact and fiction in the long period of artistic production concerning this singular traumatic event in American history Sharon Talley professor of English at Texas A M University Corpus Christi is the author of *Ambrose Bierce and the Dance of Death* and *Student Companion to Herman Melville* Her articles have appeared in *American Imago* *Journal of Men's Studies* and *Nineteenth Century Prose* *Junior High School Manual for 1925* Kansas. Stoltz, 2017-12-24 This study of military historiography examines the changing narrative of the Battle of New Orleans through two centuries of commemoration Once celebrated on par with the Fourth of July the anniversary of the Battle of New Orleans is no longer a day of reverence for most Americans The United States stunning defeat of the British army on January 8th 1815 gave rise to

the presidency of Andrew Jackson the Democratic Party and the legend of Jean Laffite Yet the battle has not been a national holiday since 1861 Joseph F Stoltz III explores how generations of Americans have consciously revised reinterpreted and reexamined the memory of the conflict to fit the cultural and social needs of their time Combining archival research with deep analyses of music literature theater and film across two centuries of American popular culture Stoltz highlights the myriad ways in which politicians artists academics and ordinary people have rewritten the battle s history From Andrew Jackson s presidential campaign to the occupation of New Orleans by the Union Army to the Jim Crow era the continuing reinterpretations of the battle alienated whole segments of the American population from its memorialization Thus a close look at the Battle of New Orleans offers an opportunity to explore not just how events are collectively remembered across generations but also how a society discards memorialization that is no longer necessary or palatable

Campbell,Niels Eichhorn,2024-04-10 While historians have acknowledged that the issues of race slavery and emancipation were not unique to the American Civil War they have less frequently recognized the conflict s similarities to other global events As renowned historian Carl Degler pointed out the Civil War was one among many such conflicts during the mid nineteenth century Understanding the Civil War s place in world history requires placing it within a global context of other mid nineteenth century political social and cultural issues and events In *The Civil War in the Age of Nationalism* Niels Eichhorn and Duncan A Campbell explore the conflict from this perspective taking a transnational and comparative approach with a particular focus on the period from the 1830s to the 1870s Eichhorn and Campbell examine the development of nationalism and its frequent manifestation secession by comparing the American experience with that of several other nations including Germany Hungary and Brazil They compare the Civil War to the Crimean and Franco German wars to determine whether the American conflict was the first modern war To gauge the potential of foreign intervention in the Civil War they look to the time s developing international debate on the legality of intercession and mediation in other nations insurgencies Using the experiences of Indigenous peoples in the Americas Africa and the Antipodes Eichhorn and Campbell suggest the extent to which the United States was an imperial project To examine realpolitik they study four vastly different practitioners Otto von Bismarck Louis Napoleon Count Cavour and Abraham Lincoln Finally they compare emancipation in the United States to that in Peru and the end of forced servitude in Russia closing with a comparison of the memorialization of the Civil War with the experiences of other post emancipation societies and an examination of how other nations mythologized their past conflicts and ignored uncomfortable truths in the pursuit of reconciliation *The Civil War in the Age of Nationalism* avoids the limitations of American exceptionalism making it the first genuine comparative and transnational study of the Civil War in an international context
