I. Objective

Students will understand and be able to apply basic addition and subtraction skills within 100. They will also start to learn the concepts of even and odd numbers.

II. Materials

- Whiteboard and markers
- Math workbooks
- Number cards (1-100)
- Counters or small objects (e.g., beans, buttons)
- Chart paper
- Pencils and erasers
- Timer
- Educational apps or online games for technology integration

III. Warm-Up Activity (10 Minutes)

1. Begin with a quick review of counting by 2s, 5s, and 10s. Write the sequences on the board and have students recite them together.
2. Play a quick number game. Call out random numbers between 1 and 100 and have students identify whether these numbers are even or odd.
3. Use number cards to prompt students to come to the board and place the card in the correct column labeled "Even" or "Odd."
