The topic I chose for the research paper is the major development theories for children and adolescents. Developmentalists considered four theoretical perspectives that fell under the "Grand" theories. These theories were psychodynamic, behaviorist, constructivist, and sociocultural. "Psychodynamic theories claim a significant place in the history of developmental science, having shown how universal developmental processes and stages can be understood by exploring the specific life experiences of particular individuals." (Lightfoot 2018) Sigmund Freud developed psychodynamic theory. Lightfoot states, that behaviorism focuses on development because of learning and changes in behavior because of forming associations between behavior and its consequences. In the constructivist theory, Piaget believes children must experience life to understand it. Lastly, sociocultural theory was developed by Lev Vygotsky. This theory is the influence of culture on development.

Modern theories of development created new insights into the fundamental issues that created a concern for developmentalists. The number of developmental theories expanded tremendously. These theories are evolutionary, social learning, information processing, and systems. Evolutionary theories explain how human behavior contributes to the survival of species and how the evolutionary past influences individual development. (Lightfoot 2018) Social learning theories are about the behavior and consequence associations that children learn. Children learn this by interacting and observing during social settings. There are many important contributions to the study of human development. Information processing theories look at cognitive development and how children perceive, remember, organize, and manipulate information in different ways. Lastly, system theories make up parts and how the wholes and parts are organized, interact, and change over time.

Kendra Cherry states that theories around child development focus on explaining how children change and grow throughout childhood. (Cherry 2020) These theories focus on different parts of development that connect to cognitive, emotional, and social growth. Picking this topic will help me increase my knowledge for my future job and even help me while I am raising two toddlers. I will already understand what is going on. My oldest son is about to be 3.
